

**MINUTES**  
**Lefors City Council Meeting**  
**April 20, 2026 - Regular Session**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Michael Ray. Present were Council members Jerry Stegall, James Gee, Savannah Kingcade, Ashley Miller, and Aaron Hunt.

Mayor Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman Gee said the Invocation.

No citizens' comments were presented.

City Judge, Kurt Curfman, submitted a written report: For the month of March 2026, we had receipts of \$0.00. There were no new complaints filed with the Court. At this current time, we have an outstanding balance of fines and court costs due the city in the amount of \$526.00 plus warrants of \$8,777.00. All local, state, and federal reports are current.

Public Works Director, Chad Young reported to Council:

Septic and Sewer System Maintenance-The Smith family Septic company was contracted to address significant sand accumulation in the sewer mains. Their team successfully cleaned out thirteen sewer manholes throughout the city. In addition, they visited the sewer plant and cleaned out three chambers responsible for directing flow to the river, which had experienced a surge buildup. Water Main Repairs-Repairs have commenced on the two-inch water main located on Second Street. This project is expected to be completed by the end of the week, pending favorable weather conditions. In the upcoming week, the two-inch water main in front of Nick Miller's house on Sixth Street will also be replaced.

Staff Training and Certification-Dalton has successfully completed his sewer class and is currently awaiting approval to take the certification test. Tree Removal-Last week, Carlos Gonzalez performed tree removal services in the city yard. Their work was thorough and well-executed. Additional Work Orders- Several outstanding work orders remain, specifically for the replacement of water meter risers that cannot be locked. These tasks will be addressed as warm weather continues, allowing for efficient completion.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to approve consent agenda items consisting of minutes of March 16, 2026, regular meeting, department reports, and bills. Councilwoman Kingcade seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilman Stegall made a motion to accept a proposal from the Texas Rural Water Association in the amount of \$8,768.00 to provide GIS mapping of the city's water lines. Councilman Gee seconded. Council members Gee, Miller, Stegall, and Kingcade voted For. Councilman Hunt abstained. Motion passed.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to accept a letter of engagement from Bryan Guyman with Underwood Law Firm to represent the city as legal counsel. Councilwoman Miller seconded. Council members Hunt, Miller, Stegall, and Gee voted For. Councilwoman Kingcade abstained. Motion passed.

Councilman Stegall made a motion to repair the black Ford with a new motor. Councilman Gee seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

No action taken regarding purchasing a truck from the Groom Fire Department.

Councilwoman Miller made a motion to adopt a resolution regarding a contract with Government Capital Credit for the purpose of financing utility truck repairs and mapping system upgrade. Councilman Stegall seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilwoman Miller made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Hunt seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 8:07 p.m.
