

**MINUTES**  
**Lefors City Council Meeting**  
**June 13, 2022 - Regular Session**  
**7:00 p.m.**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Michael Ray. Present were Council members Codi Hess, James Gee, and Aaron Hunt. Council members Savannah Kingcade and Keith Franks were absent.

Mayor Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman Gee said the Invocation.

Public works director, Landon Roberts, reported to Council that they had problems with a sewer choke at East Fourth and repaired a sewer tap on Main Street. Flow from influent at plant has increased and are hopeful most of the big issues with the sewer system have been resolved. A water leak on Third Street and a water leak on Skyline have been repaired. Fire hydrants have been placed on a schedule to flush regularly. Well number 8 was down for a few days last month until a motor starter was replaced. A contractor should be here this week to install the SCADA system for the wells and ground storage.

City Judge Kurt Curfman submitted a written report: For the month of May 2022, we had receipts of \$722.00. There were 5 new complaints or citations filed with the Court from the Marshal. These were for state or City ordinances violations. At this current time, we have outstanding balance of fines and court costs due the City of Lefors of \$8,891.00. All local, state, and federal reports are current at this time.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to approve the consent agenda items including minutes of the May 31, 2022, special meeting, bills, and department reports. Councilwoman Hess seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilman Gee made a motion to grant two easements to Ty Page that border his property. *(Easements are between Property ID 17731 and 17746, and between Property ID's 17732 and 17727)* Councilwoman Hess seconded. Council members Gee and Hess for. Council member Hunt abstained. Motion passed.

No action taken on implementation of Drought Contingency Plan. Item tabled to be reviewed at a later meeting date.

The Council convened into executive session under GC §551.074, Personnel, at 7:15 p.m. to discuss personnel issues.

The Council returned to regular session at 7:46 p.m.

Councilman Hunt brought forth his motion made in executive session to hire Nick York as Public Works Director and set his pay rate at \$16.00 per hour. Councilwoman Hess seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilman Hunt brought forth his motion made in executive session to accept application for a City Marshal, set salary at \$960.00/bi-weekly, 30 hours per week minimum, with City paid benefits of medical and retirement. Councilman Gee seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilwoman Gee brought forth her motion made in executive session to allow Landon Roberts to work for the City two days per week at his current pay rate, require Mr. Roberts to complete the class for a C water license and pass the test, and to pay him \$100.00 per month to continue to work under his wastewater license. Councilman Hunt seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

Councilman Hunt made a motion to adjourn. Councilman Gee seconded. Vote unanimous. Motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:51 p.m.
